Installation of Pastor Rachel Manke

Presentation

The assembly stands.

The dean addresses the assembly.

D: On behalf of the Southeast Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA, it is my duty and joy to install our sibling in Christ, the Rev. Rachel Manke as pastor at St. John's Lutheran Church here in Blue Bell. I ask leaders from this call process to present the documentation that makes this invitation official.

A representative of the calling body addresses the presiding minister.

A: After prayerful discernment and thorough consideration on behalf of this congregation, we have extended a call to the Rev. Rachel Manke and present her for installation today.

The representative gives the dean the letter certifying that the call has been received and accepted. The representative moves aside, and the assembly is seated.

D: Thank you for sharing your time and energy with this discernment process.
It is a blessing to the whole congregation.

Address and Questions

The dean addresses the pastor being installed.

D: *A reading from John:* Jesus said, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you. Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.” (*John 20:21-23*)

A reading from Matthew: Jesus said, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”
(*Matthew 28:18-20*)

D: Pastor Rachel, in accepting the call to ministry of word and sacrament, you promised to uphold the holy Scriptures as the word of God, to confess the creeds and the Lutheran confessions as theological context for understanding the word of God, and to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ. Will you continue to study Scripture, pray for God’s people, serve others for the sake of justice, and keep your baptismal promises in this community?

PR: I will, and I ask God to help me.

D: Will you set an example of healthy leadership, keep the Sabbath, practice boundaries, care for relationships, and seek the resource and support you need to maintain a wholistic well-being?

PR: I will, and I ask God to help me.

D: Will you bear witness to God’s love in the world, helping this congregation build trust, seek justice, and share love with the wider community?

PR: I will, and I ask God to help me.

D: Will you discern and do what is right, even when it disrupts the status quo, and especially when it asks something difficult for the sake of our neighbors?

PR: I will, and I ask God to help me.

D: May the God who has called you in baptism and set you apart in the ministry of word and sacrament continue to bless you with the conviction and grace to do these things for the sake of Jesus and this community of faith.

The assembly responds:

A: We pray for individuals in positions of authority. Raise up wise and discerning leaders in federal, state, and local governments and guide them to seek the benefit of every person. Lord, in your mercy,

C: hear our prayer.

A: We pray for all who are in need. Support and encourage those who are unemployed, underemployed, or experiencing poverty. Bring food, shelter, clothes, and stability for daily life. Lord, in your mercy,

C: hear our prayer.

A: We pray for this congregation, especially those beginning a new school year. Empower teachers and school administrators. Guide students in their learning and development. Accompany parents, foster parents, and caregivers who provide encouragement and love. Lord, in your mercy,

C: hear our prayer.

A: We give thanks for the faithful departed who showed us how to honor God with our heart. Inspire us by their example and renew our faith, trusting that we will be united with them in glory. Lord, in your mercy,

C: hear our prayer.

A: Receive these prayers, O God, and those in our hearts known only to you; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen.




