The Arts at St. John's



The Arts at St. John's opens its' 17th season on Sunday, October 1 with a Woodwind Concert at 4 p.m. It is the first time a program for this combination has been featured on our series.

No section of an orchestra can boast the sheer range of tonal color than the woodwinds. Whereas the string and brass sections each have a more blended and homogeneous sound, the woodwind instruments are all completely distinct from each other, not just in timbre and tone, but in the very way that they create the vibrations that initiate the sound. From Mozart through the modern era, composers have relied on the woodwinds to be their painters palette.

As a result of the differences in the instruments, a challenge of playing in a woodwind quintet is to create a unified sound. However, there are also a myriad of ways to combine the sounds together to make new colors and effects, not to mention the potential to play the differences off of each other for great effect.

The woodwind quintet as a form was firmly established by Anton Reicha and Franz Danzi, two composers who specialized in the genre, and whose lives and styles bridged the Classical and early Romantic eras. Composers during the 19th century continued to prefer strings and piano for their chamber music works. The Italian composer Ludwig Thuille's beautiful and romantic *Sextet for Piano and Winds* is a notable exception to this, and remains one of the few works of his that is still performed in the modern era.

It was the turn of the century, however, that saw the great leap forward in wind writing. Wanting to distance themselves from the string-dominated Romantic era and forge new ground, composers started seeking out new forms and new sounds as a way to express their art. And what better place to look than the wood-winds?! The 20th century saw an enormous surge not just in the more prominent role of winds in orchestral writing, but in the amount of music written specifically for winds. In France, Francis Poulenc and five of his contemporaries (a group named "Les Six") decisively set out in this direction. Poulenc wrote sonatas for nearly every wind instrument (he died before he could complete his bassoon sonata), and wrote some of the most thrilling and enduring wind chamber music of his era. His *Sextet for Piano and Winds* is no exception. From the raucous outer movements to the sublime and soaring slow movement, it is an example of woodwind writing at it's best.

Westchester, PA native son Samuel Barber continued this tradition in the middle of the century. He was commissioned to write *Summer Music* by the Chamber Music Society of Detroit. (Each member of the Society donated a small amount towards the project, in one of the earliest examples of what we now know as crowd funding.) Originally planned as a piece for winds, strings and piano, the evocative work eventually evolved into a wind quintet as he composed it. It's difficulty is matched by its ingenuity and beauty, an it remains one of the move beloved gems of the wind quintet repertoire to this day.




