#### Finance Announcements

Our Generosity Team, aka Stewardship Committee, sent out a letter in early November to all member households regarding the building of the 2019 budget and also shared our needs for the future mission and ministry of St. John. Commitment cards were also with the letter—please return the cards by December 1 if possible.

Giving through the plates is up this year by 2.6%, and we give thanks for our members for this year's response. For 2019, we ask that our members prayerfully consider upping their offering each week just \$3-5 more, or \$12-15 a month, or \$150-250 a year. The costs of doing "church" just like the cost of "living" has gone up, and we are ever mindful that we need to provide well of our church's future. Thank you for your gifts of time, talent and treasures to St. John.



## Third Quarter Report from the Treasurer

Pastor, and Church Council would like to thank all the members of St John for their continued generosity in 2018. Giving is up this year by 2.6% over 2017. However, we are a minus 3.5% behind our 2018 budget goals.

#### **Current Fund**

Your response in giving has allowed us to reduce our draw on the Endowment to cover current operating expenses. Last year we needed to take \$60,000 from the endowment to cover our operating expenses. At the end of 2018 it appears we will need \$56,000. It is important we continue to reduce this reliance on the Endowment to pay our current bills.

As you can see the three sources of church funding are clearly outlined with the percentage of total funding each source contributes. We need your continued generous support to help reduce our current \$5,133 budget shortfall in **Congregational Giving**. Most of the shortfall is in Weekly Current Envelopes. Please keep those weekly envelopes coming even when you have to miss a Sunday service. Most of our expenses are fairly fixed and we need your support throughout the year.

**Third Party Income** is on target. This year the Nursery School contribution reflects a larger allocation to cover their share of insurance cost. This increase has made up for the loss income from the **1810 house**. Our seminary family graduated, and despite a lot of effort we have yet to find a new seminarian renter.

#### **Endowment**

Year to date our Endowment has seen weak financial performance. After expenses we have only earned about 1% return on our investments, well below our average 6% to 8% return. However our need for endowment funds to pay part of our current expenses and critical capital repairs remains. Through September we have taken \$64,350 from the Endowment. The St John Endowment is down -4.25% from the beginning of the year and the Cemetery Fund up 1% (we have not needed to take funds for Cemetery needs).


